
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Assembly Instructions

1. Place the base legs on the ground, ensuring that it is standing correctly. After this, take the padded guitar rest and lay it against the base legs (as seen in the picture on the top left).

2. Whilst holding the padded guitar rest to the base leg, insert a large screw and a small screw in the areas shown in the top right picture, securing them and the padded guitar rest in place by using two nuts.







3. On the other side of the padded guitar rest, ensure that the holes in the metal part of the padded guitar rest align with the holes in the base leg. Once they do, insert a large screw into the holes and secure the padded guitar rest and the base leg together using a nut. Repeat these steps on the back of the base legs.





4. Attach the rack support pole onto the back of the base legs by lining the holes in the sections (seen above in the top left) with each other. After this, push a small screw through the hole and secure the pieces into place using a nut. Repeat this with the other side.



5. Place the padded racking bar onto the rack support poles (ensuring that the holes in both line up with each other). Once they do, insert a large screw into the holes and hold the padded racking bar and one of the rack support pole together using a large screw on the top and pushing a medium screw though the rack support pole. Repeat this with the other rack support pole. Make sure that these are securely held in place before applying any weight to them.

6. Once you have completed the racking, go over all the screws and nuts to make sure that they are correctly tightened and are unlikely to come undone in the near future. When placing and taking guitars from the guitar rack, be careful not to use too much force as this could lead to the eventual damage of the guitar rack or the guitar itself.
